



COMPETITION ENTRY FORM

The Hawke's Bay A&P Society, owns and manages the Napier Port Hawke's Bay Primary Sector Awards. These awards have a long history and contribute significantly to the primary industry across the region, they tell the story of excellence within rural Hawke's Bay and celebrate success, business innovation and growth. We welcome your entry and wish you luck with the process.

Criteria

- The competition is open to any agricultural and pastoral farm owner, manager or leasee in the areas covered by the Wairoa District south of the Mohaka River, the Napier City Council, and the Hastings and Waipukurau District Councils.
- Judging is based on profitability, management skills, care, appearance and performance of land, crops, pastures, and stock. Management and physical aspects are judged by two competent field judges visiting selected properties. The measures of profitability will be economic farm surplus and percentage return on total farm capital.
- Supply an electronic copy of your annual accounts (farm working, livestock, and depreciation accounts) for the financial years ending 2022/2023 and 2023/2024. Judging will be based on 2023/2024, but the 2022/2023 accounts are used to check fluctuations. Accounts can be sent direct from yourself with your application or your accountant to awards@hbap.co.nz
- Supply a USB stick or an online link of at least 10 images of the property including an image of yourselves. These images will also be used for promotional purposes if required, please only submit images that can be used.
- If you become a successful finalist, you must supply a spreadsheet of your business suppliers which will be used for media purposes if you win for example transport operators, stock agent, banker etc.
- Entrants must be pursuing a system of agriculture and/or pastoral farming which will maintain high and sustainable performance over a long term. The farm holding must be a full-time commercial operation for at least one person.
- There is no limitation as to normal diversification systems/options in agricultural, pastoral or livestock pursuits within the confines of (4) above.
- With the winner's co-operation an open field day, organised and will be held on the winner's farm approximately 4 weeks post awards dinner.

Field judging will be the week of 17th of March 2025
Field day will be mid-May 2025
